Topics of educational seminars for this purpose include: Personal, Family, and Business Financial Education, Legal Aspects, Marketing and Sales, Business Accounting, Motivational, Self-improvement and Self-motivation Workshops, Funding for your Business: agencies including SBDC, SBA, SCORE, MBDA, LIFT FUND, a culturally acclimated version of the "Dress for Success Program", Personal Finance, Negotiation Skills, Job Search (including resume building and interview training), Personal Branding, Taxes, Networking skills, among others.
